LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF

The women of the ELCA are *preparing school and personal care kits*. Some of the items needed for the **personal care kits** include: soap (bars), nail clippers, big tooth combs, tooth-brushes, hand towels and wash cloths. Items needed for the **school kits** include: notebooks, pencils, 24 count crayons, rulers, scissors, erasers, pens and pencil sharpeners. Check out the local sales for 'back to school' items! A container for your donated items will be located in the narthex.

Luther Park in Chetek, WI is one of the Bible Camps that our youngsters have attended for over 60 years. (I, Kathy, attended there as a 7th grader in 1958 and several more times in high school!) They are in the midst of a fund raising portion of a Capital Campaign in order to upgrade their facilities. A matching funds opportunity exists from now until the end of the year; every dollar donated to Luther Park Capital Campaign will be matched up to \$500,000 which would then meet their goal. Our council has discussed ways to assist with this project. We will have envelopes available in the Narthex beginning Sunday, September 5th. Each will be labeled with a dollar amount from \$1 to \$144. Please take an envelope for the amount that you would like to donate, place either cash or a check made out to Zion Lutheran Church with Luther Park Capital Campaign listed at the bottom of the check for that amount (or higher is ok too), into the labeled envelope and place in the offering plate or outside drop box. We are hoping to raise as much as \$5,000 to assist with this upgrade to provide good camping experiences and growth in faith for our youth and adults. Donation envelopes will be available through October 10th.



Kid's Sermon

FIRST LESSON Psalm 116

¹I love the LORD, because he has heard my voice and my supplications.

²Because he inclined his ear to me, therefore I will call on him as long as I live.

³The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of Sheol laid hold on me; I suffered distress and anguish.

⁴Then I called on the name of the LORD: "O LORD, I pray, save my life!"

⁵Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; our God is merciful.

⁶The LORD protects the simple; when I was brought low, he saved me.

Return, O my soul, to your rest, for the LORD has dealt bountifully with you.

⁸For you have delivered my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling.

⁹I walk before the LORD in the land of the living.

SECOND LESSON James 3: 1-12

Not many of you should become teachers, my brothers and sisters, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. For all of us make many mistakes. Anyone who makes no mistakes in speaking is perfect, able to keep the whole body in check with a bridle. If we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we guide their whole bodies. Or look at ships: though they are so large that it takes strong winds to drive them, yet they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs. So also the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great exploits. How great a forest is set ablaze by a small fire! And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of nature, and is itself set on fire by hell. For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse those who are made in the likeness of God. From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and brackish water? Can a fig tree, my brothers and sisters, yield olives, or a grapevine figs? No more can salt water yield fresh.

Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." ³⁰And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him.

³¹Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. ³²He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

³⁴He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."
