Members of Zion, believe it or not, Lent is right around the corner!

February 14th is not only Valentines Day, but also Ash Wednesday! Our Wednesday evenings will start at 5:15 with a soup supper and then at 6:00pm we will gather upstairs for worship together.

You may or may not know, Lent can be traced back to 325AD, meaning it was only a couple hundred years after Jesus rose when the church decided they wanted to be intentional about having a time of preparation before Easter. And now 1699 years later, we continue the tradition.

Personally, I know I have family members that live different places that don't go to church, but would probably accept an invitation if someone asked.

It's a little hard, but give it some thought. On my sabbatical, when we asked people in churches across the country, "What has kept you active in your faith?" By far the most cited response is that "they have friends in church." It really gets us back to the basics. Maybe for Lent, you could be extra intentional about talking with someone you see at church but don't usually connect with.

It can be hard, and push us outside our comfort zones, but according to my sabbatical research, the church really depends on all these "small, little actions" that maybe, might not be so small, that maybe might be how someone experiences God's love at Zion.

In conclusion, as I like to lift up during worship offering time, thank you for your participation in ministry here, and thank you for your offerings of all kinds! For the faith actions you do that are noticed, and for those only noticed by our Father in Heaven.

We are lucky to have you here.

Zion Lutheran is an inclusive faith community committed to sincere hospitality and dedicated to love Jesus, grow in faith and to serve our neighbor.

Members of this congregation strive to treat each other with love and respect despite differences. To that end we covenant together to follow the guidelines outlined below:

1. Concerns or complaints:

Outreach

- regarding other members: the individual goes to the person involved first. If there is no resolution, then they take the issue to the Pastor.
- regarding staff members: go to them first. If no response, then speak to the Pastor and 2 or more officers at the same time. <u>If there is no resolution the issue may be taken to the council.</u>
- regarding the pastor: speak to the pastor first. If there is no resolution speak to the pastor and 2 or more officers at the same time. If there is no resolution, the issue will be taken to the council. If there is no resolution, the council will contact the bishop for assistance.
- In the event of continuing issues, we follow the procedures outlined in our constitution.
- 2. Phone calls:
- office: messages left on the office phone will be answered in a timely manner. For emergencies contact the pastor. If you do not receive a response to your non-emergency message in a timely manner, leave a second message.
- the pastor's phone will be answered if possible unless on vacation. Texts or messages will be answered within 24 hours or on the next business day. Emergencies will be addressed immediately.
- -if the pastor is on vacation contact the pastor on call; the name and phone number will be on the church answering machine.
- 3. Emails will be answered in a timely manner. If there is no response, please call.
- 4. Questions and concerns can be written on the back of a communion card or on paper and placed in the office or offering plates. Written concerns that are not signed will not be addressed.
