This Lenten season, our series on Wednesday night has been "Lent: what feeds you," a slightly ironic title as traditionally during let we fast from something, to redirect that attention go God and how we can better follow Jesus.

Do you ever ask yourself this question, "What truly feeds me?" What makes you feel alive as God created you to be?

Every so often, I will make a list of items, goals, or aspirations that I know making time for them gives me life. And if I make a list and it's obvious that I'm checking nothing off of it, I know I need to figure out where to find time.

But there's a balance, because life comes with endless to-do lists right? So do we really need one more? But finding time to fill yourself in the ways God created you to find life, helps with all the other aspects in life.

One of the things I like to do is to cook.

And there can be such meaning and memory in different foods. Not necessarily all the day-to-day staples, but the celebratory foods. Maybe foods that we'll think about making for Easter or Christmas.

What are the foods that can take you back, keeping you connected to people who have long passed into God's care?

As a Norwegian Lutheran, we joke about Lutfisk because it is kind of funny, but it always takes me back to my grandma's table, and my Grandpa always thinking that he needed to put more Lutfisk my plate! Food can connect us together, which has it's roots in scripture too.

The Lord's Supper, that we call communion, literally connects us to Jesus in this holy sacrament, and not only do we commune with Jesus, but one another, around a table, where everyone is welcome. And for Jesus, 2000 years ago, that meal connected him to his Hebrew ancestors in Egypt, the Passover, the unleavened bread, and the freedom that was achieved by God through Moses. For Jesus in this holy meal, instituting communion, the holy sacrament, helps give us the same thing, freedom, only the freedom from Sin and it's power.

But here's the thing; let's say you make that list I mentioned earlier, and you're nowhere near where you want to be. Part of what Jesus' sacrament was for, was to let you know that you are still loved and valued, right now where you are... even just as much as you will be, if you accomplished all those goals.

So again, it's this balance.

God loves you now. God also wants you to experience abundant life in Him and these specific ways of living, the ways of Jesus, that help us see the world, (and ourselves!) So much differently. May you feel Blessed by God this Season of Lent, as get closer to Holy week, the devastation of the Cross, and the victory in the Resurrection of Jesus. This one who said "in the world you will have trouble, but take heart, for I have overcome the world." May these words of Christ help fill you this Lenten Season.

Zion Lutheran is an inclusive faith community committed to sincere hospitality and dedicated to love Jesus, grow in faith and to serve our neighbor.

Members of this congregation strive to treat each other with love and respect despite differences. To that end we covenant together to follow the guidelines outlined below: 1. Concerns or complaints:

- regarding other members: the individual goes to the person involved first. If there is no resolution, then they take the issue to the Pastor.

- regarding staff members: go to them first. If no response, then speak to the Pastor and 2 or more officers at the same time. <u>If there is no resolution the issue may be taken</u> to the council.

- regarding the pastor: speak to the pastor first. If there is no resolution speak to the pastor and 2 or more officers at the same time. If there is no resolution, the issue will be taken to the council. If there is no resolution, the council will contact the bishop for assistance.

- In the event of continuing issues, we follow the procedures outlined in our constitution.

2. Phone calls:

• office: messages left on the office phone will be answered in a timely manner.

For emergencies contact the pastor. If you do not receive a response to your non-emergency message in a timely manner, leave a second message.

- the pastor's phone will be answered if possible unless on vacation. Texts or messages will be answered within 24 hours or on the next business day. Emergencies will be addressed immediately.

-if the pastor is on vacation contact the pastor on call; the name and phone number will be on the church answering machine.

3. Emails will be answered in a timely manner. If there is no response, please call.

4. Questions and concerns can be written on the back of a communion card or on paper and placed in the office or offering plates. Written concerns that are not signed will not be addressed.

Zion Lutheran Congregation Council Minutes January 16th. 2024

Present: Lori Meinking, president; Kathy Meunier, Secretary; Sheryl Arms, Treasurer; Karen Weltzien, Social Concerns; Beth Meunier, Music and Worship; Pastor Joe Iverson. Abby Braunreiter, Youth; Joe Roehl, Financial Secretary, and Judy Roehl, Outreach were present via video/phone chat. Abby left the meeting at 7:21 PM.

Absent: Louise Janke, Membership and Shepherding; Dave Nuland, Property and Grounds.

The meeting was called to order by President Lori Meinking at 6:34pm. Devotions and prayer were led by Pastor Joe.

Lori Meinking made a motion to approve the December Council minutes; the motion was seconded and passed. Kathy Meunier made a motion to approve the treasurer's report; the motion was seconded and passed.

Old Business:

Kitchen remodel update- suggestion was made to the council that a kitchen planner be consulted. Lori Meinking will facilitate this and have plans discussed with Marilyn Reedy, representatives from WELCA, the summer food program and building and grounds members.

Information regarding the synod symposium for officers and council members was shared.

New business:

Council members on call while Pastor Joe is gone January 23-26 will be Kathy Meunier and Karen Weltzien.

Lenten service will begin February 14th. Soup suppers will be offered provided by various members with free will offering to go the kitchen remodeling project. Mothers of Preschoolers (MOPS) requests to have a rummage sale in the Fellowship Hall on April 6th with 80 % of the proceeds to go to MOPS expenses, 10% to the kitchen improvement project, and 10% to go to the Summer Lunch Program. They also asked that a bake sale be held; this will be offered first to Zion WELCA; if they are not interested, the opportunity for a local Lutheran Church to have it as a fund raiser for the Youth Gathering this summer would be offered. (Zion has no students interested in attending). Motion was made by Lori Meinking to approve the thrift sale and bake sale; motion was seconded and approved. Set up will begin no earlier than 1 PM on the Tuesday prior to the event and all unsold items are to be removed that day.


- The proposed 2024 budget which was prepared by the Finance Committee was reviewed. Kathy Meunier made the motion to approve it for presentation at the annual meeting where it is voted on for final approval. Motion was seconded and approved.
- The Finance committee requests clarification of our tithing practices- is our tithe (goes to the Synod) to be on general offering or on all monies that come into Zion. It has taken several years to reach our goal, set 6 or 7 years ago by the council, of tithing (10%) on the general fund. A lengthy discussion followed. Kathy Meunier made a motion that our tithe for2024 be 11% on general fund /offerings. Motion was seconded and passed.
- The question of whether Zion could sponsor a Red Cross blood drive was posed. Lori Meinking will check into this.

Information and reports:

- Pastor Joe's report included that he visited 6 members in the last month; confirmation will resume this week. Custodian position has been posted on Facebook.
- Beth Meunier, Music and Worship expressed thanks to the officers and council members who will be finished with their terms after the annual meeting for their excellent service: Dave Nuland, Lori Meinking, Judy Roehl, and Joe Roehl.
- Recent MOPS activities included speakers on the Christmas story from the viewpoint of a mother and a canvas painting class. They request our prayers as they bring in the Gospel whenever visiting with the other moms.

The next meeting will be February 20, 2024

Motion to adjourn was made by Karen Weltzien. It was seconded and passed. The meeting was adjourned at with the Lord's Prayer at 8:31. Kathy Meunier, Council Secretary
